Notes to poem:

Soenda Kelapa: is a historical term that refers to the area now known as Sunda Kelapa, which is the old port of Jakarta, Indonesia. The name Sunda Kelapa is derived from the Sunda Kingdom, an ancient kingdom in West Java, and *kelapa* meaning coconut in Indonesian. Historically, the port of Sunda Kelapa was a significant trading hub in Southeast Asia. Sunda Kelapa was the principal harbour of the Sunda Kingdom before the

arrival of the Dutch, and it remained a crucial port in the region, even as Jakarta (formerly Batavia) became the centre of Dutch colonial rule in the 17th century. The port facilitated trade between Java and other parts of the world, particularly with Chinese, Arab, and European traders. Today, Sunda Kelapa is located in the north of Jakarta, near the Old Town (Kota Tua) area, and it is still an active harbour, although it is now mostly used by traditional wooden schooners (called *phinisi*) for inter-island trade. It is also a popular tourist destination, with remnants of the old port and Dutch colonial-era buildings.

Kompeni: The term derives from the Dutch 'compagnie' ('company') referring to the East Indies Company (VOC - Verenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie). This powerful trading entity existed during the colonial period in Indonesia (formerly the Dutch East Indies) and was one of the first multinational corporations in the world.
